Tuesday, June 27th

Ukrainian Refugee Day

Our guide for the day will be Dane Miller – US Military Veteran that moved to Poland following Russia's invasion of Ukraine and founded Volunteers for Ukraine (<https://volunteerforukraine.org/>)

Breakfast: At your hotel

8:30am: Pick up at the front of your hotel.

9:00am - Visit Expo refugee center to tour and spend time with impacted families – Modlinska - Krzysztof, Robert, and Emily are POCs

10:30am: Visit with western volunteers that support Volunteers for Ukraine. This will include a volunteer passing through with humanitarian aid on their way to the border, stopping at Expo center. Meet with Ukrainian warriors receiving prosthetics that are passing through Warsaw (Kind Deeds or Protez Foundation)

11:00am: Travel time between destinations / comfort break

11:30am – 1:00pm: Lunch at [Radio Café \(radiocafe.pl\)](http://radiocafe.pl) to enjoy traditional Polish cuisine and a touch of Polish history from the Nazi and Soviet eras propaganda machines. We can meet the founder and owner Stanisław Prószyński, a journalist and reporter born in 1935 who worked for Radio Free Europe. He is often around, speaks beautiful English. Radio Cafe has employed Ukrainians since the beginning of the full-scale war.

1:00pm: Travel time between destinations / comfort break

1:15pm – 3:00pm: In partnership with Medical University of Warsaw, meet at the Ukrainian cultural hub to spend time with Ukrainian children directly impacted by the war.

4:00pm: Return to hotels.

5:15pm: Ladies only Cocktail Party at Verte Hotel (Verte Suite) Apartament Verte – Room 102 Hosted by Inga Kaplan for the “Women of KPSF” (10-minute walk between hotels or Uber)

Friday, June 30th –

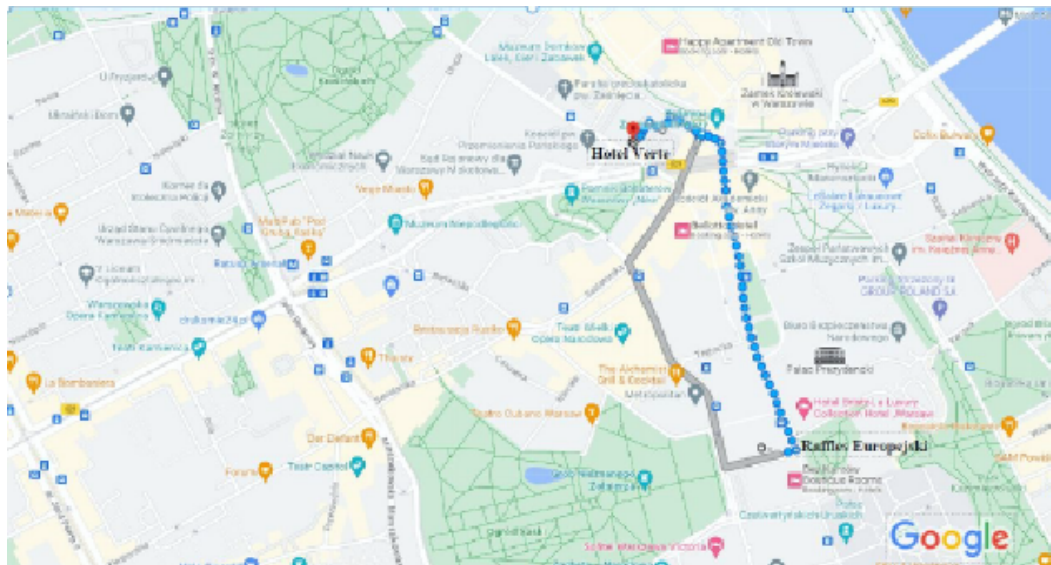
Breakfast at hotel.

Tim Mak is an Investigative Correspondent for National Public Radio, where he has worked since 2018. In that role, he focuses on accountability journalism and enterprise reporting. He appears regularly on NPR's Morning Edition and All Things Considered. For thirteen years, he has covered politics, national security, Congress and nonprofit organizations. During that time, he has worked for a variety of publications, including The Daily Beast and Politico. His foreign reporting has taken him to South Sudan, Ethiopia, Djibouti, Japan and Hong Kong.
